In fact, I believe the U.S. Open subsequently became one of the tournaments in which the Shuffleboard Federation became heavily involved. I do have a T-shirt somewhere in my souvenir collection showing at least a dozen shuffleboard tournament locations, from San Diego to Philadelphia.

Subsequently, John and I would visit briefly with John at various tournaments. I was always impressed with his seemingly tireless effort in promoting and organizing table shuffleboard tournaments. I was introduced to John 18 years ago at the 1986 US Open in Austin, Texas and was told by others that he was going to be one of the top players in the game. I was also told he intended to make a living at the game of shuffleboard. For the next two days, I watched as he ran over some of the best players in the country. He almost won the pro singles.

Two weeks later, he shows up at the Ace of Clubs in Marysville, CA for the Annual Labor Day Tournament. Again, a big showing. Playing well, he finished first in doubles and third in singles. He made a big impression on all of us at that time early in his career. Also he demonstrated he was innovative – he played singles wearing a walkman radio.

Soon, with Phil Skover, the Shuffleboard Federation was founded. John realized the need for well-run tournaments and the need to equalize the game so all players could participate. In 1989 he helped, along with Ron Bowers, form the present rating system so that players could be divided into groups based on individual abilities.

By dividing players into separate groups based on skill level, large tournaments again became successful – everyone felt they had a chance to win and participation increased dramatically. All tournaments, large and small, instituted the skill level approach and we've seen an infusion of new players. The successful NASC tournament founded by John and the Federation is a great example.

John also realized the need for improved shuffleboard supplies and equipment. New weights, wax and other quality supplies emerged through the Federation, which have become the standard of the industry. His energy and innovation has paid off big time to promote the game of shuffleboard and to the benefit of all of its participants. We all thank you John.

As a top pro player, John has won or placed in over 160 tournaments over the past twenty-five years and is presently ranked among the five highest rated shuffleboard players.
