

## HARVEY'S STORY

As evidenced by the photo below, Harvey and Lilly were married on March 26, 1955. They have five beautiful daughters: Kathy, Ellen, Julie, Cindy, and Carolyn (Photo on Page 3). Four of his daughters and their families live in Houston, TX. One daughter and her family lives in California. Harvey has seven grandchildren, plus two more by marriage, as well as five great-grandchildren. Harvey has a twin brother, Jimmy Kidd, who played league before Harvey carved his own path. Harvey is

semi-retired. His work responsibilities and professional history include Construction Superintendent, Business Owner–Equipment/Moving Truck Rentals, and Safety Man.

In the Table Shuffleboard arena, Harvey is everything from player, to sponsor, to promoter, to auctioneer. His journey with us began around the 1958 timeframe. He first got involved in shuffleboard by watching the great players of the time compete in league. He began playing in leagues in the 1960's; one with Billy Mays, one horse-collar league, and of late, the Funhangers league. Throughout his course of time, he has attended as many events and tournaments as possible. His passion for the game and the people who play this game runs very deep. It is in his heart and soul.

# HARVEY'S STORY (Continued)

Harvey has had many, many accomplishments during his span of competitive shuffleboard years, from national level, to local level, and everything in between. One of Harvey's fine talents is entertaining the crowds as the Primo Auctioneer! His colorful descriptions of the players being auctioned, are not only enlightening, but exhibits just how well he absorbs his peers and their unique playing abilities. He really takes the time to get to know as many players as possible and where they are from. His sponsorship of events includes donating trucks to transport boards, his own finances to support a sale as a sponsor, or backing someone who may need a little financial assistance. His wise nature knows a sound investment when he sees it. It is no secret that Harvey is always willing to help new players to better understand the various levels of this game...on a level that the receiver will best absorb...and he does it well!

On an awards recognition level, Harvey was presented the honor of being inducted into the Texas State Shuffleboard Hall of Fame in 1998. Harvey has contributed back to the Table Shuffleboard Arena by assuming the responsibility of serving as a TSA Director since December 1999. Another recognition extended his way was the George and Donna Wilber Award which was presented in 2012 in Reno, NV at the NASC<sup>TM</sup> tournament.

Let's take a deeper look in Harvey's journey as we read what others have experienced having Harvey in their life...and how he has touched their hearts.



#### **DANNY HERSOM** (Texas)

I met Harvey in 1966. He had a crew working in the Amarillo area. They would come to The Bluetop at night to play shuffleboard. Harvey was the best player at that time. He would end up playing Fred Harris, Amarillo's best player. They played "keep hammer" in those days. Harvey always came out ahead of Fred. The next time I ran into Harvey was in Odessa, TX in 1972. Same thing, he was working there. There were a lot of keep hammer players back then,

such as Billy Mays, Earl Kelly, Rod Cameron, Fred Harris, and Harvey Kidd. I'm sure I left a lot out. Harvey was one of the best that I had seen play. Harvey has been around a long time and deserves to be in the Shuffleboard Hall of Fame. "Thanks, Amarillo Danny

I first met Harvey in 1986 at Don Valk's US Open tournament. He was doing the auction for the pro singles, and implored the crowd to give me a Texas welcome by running up my Calcutta. He let me know how much the winner was going to appreciate the donation from a Yankee.

He also explained

to me the difference between a Yankee and a damned Yankee. For those of you who don't know the difference, a damned Yankee is the kind that goes to Texas for a visit, and doesn't go back home.

Shortly after that time, I was in need of a truck for about six weeks to transport 8 boards from Houston to two tournaments that I was running, one in Lincoln, NE, and Denver, CO. Harvey was involved in that business at that point in time, and gave me a ridiculously good deal on a 24' truck. Even though he hardly knew me, he realized that I was trying to do something good for shuffleboard, and that was good enough for him.



For as long as I have known him, and probably longer, he has consistently been one of Table Shuffleboard's great sponsors and promoters. He has a long history of supporting leagues and tournaments, and also has sponsored countless players. He is always one of the first people to step up to the plate in any fundraising efforts for the shuffleboard community. His many years of service as a Director of the TSA has helped to preserve and advance the game, and his well-known reputation as being a man of the highest integrity has lent credibility to the Table Shuffleboard Association and its efforts to advance our sport.
